



Screening Event at Arizona State University

The Jewish Genetic Diseases Center has received a grant from the Jewish Community Foundation of Greater Phoenix that will provide carrier testing for nine Jewish genetic diseases **free of charge** to 80 students on the ASU campus. The testing will also be available to community members for a nominal charge.

The carrier testing is scheduled to take place on Thursday, October 16, at the Memorial Union on the ASU campus between 10 AM and 5 PM.

Cooperating organizations include Hillel ASU, Chabad ASU, Jewish Arizonans on Campus, Alpha Epsilon Phi, Alpha Epsilon Pi, and Sigma Alpha Mu. The testing is also being supported by the ASU Jewish Studies Program and by the ASU Campus Health Service.

To register for the free carrier testing, please click on the link at the bottom of this page and complete the registration form. Please let us know what time you anticipate coming to the Memorial Union for your free testing. Pre-registered participants will receive priority treatment at the event. **We cannot assure free testing for those who fail to pre-register.**

To be eligible for free testing, you must be of Eastern European Jewish descent (90% of the American Jewish community is of Eastern European Jewish descent), 18 years of age or older (but less than 46 years of age) and you must present a valid student ID when you come for your tests.

Community members who are not eligible for free carrier testing and who wish to have the testing done should call the Center at 480-668-3347 to pre-register. There will be a nominal charge of \$50 and prepayment will be required.

These tests, when done on an individual basis through a medical office, cost over \$2500. ASU students should not miss this opportunity to have these tests done at no cost through the generosity of the Jewish Community Foundation.
